COMMUNITY IMPACT - MOSS ROSE COTTAGE

As a new ongoing feature within the newsletter we are looking to promote the good news stories coming out of contractor engagement with local projects.

This quarter we are focusing on Moss Rose cottage in Rumney. See below Bernadette's story, Founder and Executive Director of Moss Rose Cottage.



As the founder of a small Not-for-Profit organisation in Rumney Cardiff called Moss Rose Cottage, and as the only full time member of staff there; I cannot express just how grateful I am for every single moment of time, kindness and expertise, generously offered by so many contractors over the last few years, as they honour and truly embody their Social Value commitments within the local community.

At Moss Rose Cottage we support adults with non-visible barriers, offering social opportunities and skills to enable people to create full and satisfying lives for themselves.

This contractor support is vital in allowing us to continue to offer this service which is free to all.

There are so many gaps in my skill set and limits to my financial opportunities, that without such specialist input, there is no way that I would be able to maintain our beautiful surroundings and keep our attendees safe there without this assistance.

In addition to the practical input such as mending and building sheds, improving gates, fencing and gardening that has been done by all, we also benefited hugely from specific Health & Safety appraisals, advice and input from Wates; Digital support and advice from CMB in addition to the meticulous preparations for our recent birthday party and Christmas sale entirely overseen by the team from Keir. Incredibly, Kier have also created specific architectural drawings for us, which will allow me to apply for a substantial grant in the near future, finally making Moss Rose Cottage accessible to wheelchair users.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

As a result of this support, I have been inspired and enabled to keep moving forward, even when I am struggling and overwhelmed during some pretty dark days.

Lastly, regarding financial support, we are particularly grateful to have been given a contract to engrave a personalised plant pot for each new home in Wates' latest development 'Caeu Masarn/Maple Fields' giving us a vital source of revenue. We were also supported by Wates Construction to apply for a Wates Family Enterprise Trust grant earlier this year, which enabled us to complete a huge project supporting Unpaid Carers earlier this year. More about that next time.

So a huge thank you to you all, but special mentions to Sophie from Wates, Jess from Kier and Sarah from CMB. I hope you recognise what an impact you have had.

KNOX & WELLS - LLANISHEN FACH

The new Dosbarth Enfys meaning Rainbow Class at Llanishen Fach Primary School was built to offer a nurturing, fully integrated environment where diversity is celebrated and every child is supported to thrive.

The purpose-built facility delivered by Knox & Wells, and procured via the SEWSCAP3 Framework will provide much-needed places for children with severe and complex learning needs, helping Cardiff address the increasing demand for specialist provision.

Key Features of the New Building

- Four purpose-built classrooms designed for children with severe and complex learning needs.
- Multipurpose OT room for therapy and specialist support.
- Large indoor-outdoor classroom with biophilic design (light, nature, calm).
- Bespoke sensory room for regulation and wellbeing.
- Accessible facilities for personal care.
- Space for a large staff team to collaborate, offering joined-up, child-led approaches

The £4.4m development has been funded by the Welsh Government's Band B programme, with support from the Council's capital programme. As with all Education Projects, Community Wellbeing Benefits (CWB) form part of the tender assessment. Knox and Wells have linked in with the local community to support the u9s Rhiwbina Squirrels Rugby team to provide one of the Main sponsors for the next 2 years.



Members of the team were presented with the kit at site with key members of the construction team.

Knox & Wells were delighted to present the Rhiwbina Squirrels U9s rugby team with their new kit yesterday at Cardiff Council's freshly completed Specialist Resource Base in Llanishen Fach Primary School.

We're very proud to support such a great club and community, and we wish the boys the best of luck in their coming season!



LOVELL HOUSING PARTNERSHIP LAUNCH

New era for housing delivery in Cardiff and Vale



Cardiff Council, Vale of Glamorgan Council and housing specialist Lovell Partnerships have formally established a partnership to deliver a transformative housing scheme across the region.

The first of its kind in recent years with two councils working together with a developer, the collaboration marks a significant milestone in the local authorities' commitment to providing highquality, affordable, and market-sale homes for communities in their areas.

Marking the formal start of the partnership, after Lovell Partnerships was appointed as preferred bidder to deliver the Cardiff and Vale Housing Partnership earlier this year, Leader of Cardiff Council, Cllr Huw Thomas and Cabinet Member for Housing and Communities, Cllr Lynda Thorne were joined by Leader of Vale of Glamorgan Council, Councillor Lis Burnett and Vale Cabinet Member for Public Sector Housing and Tenant Engagement, Cllr Sandra Perkes and Regional Managing Director, James Duffett, Regional Project Director, Shane Jay and Regeneration and Partnerships Director, Mary Parsons from

Lovell at County Hall, Cardiff Bay today to sign the partnership charter.

The charter sets the partnership's vision and objectives to deliver affordable homes and regenerate communities across Cardiff and the Vale, with around 2,500 homes including around 1.600 new council homes across 25 sites.



LLAMAU SLEEP ON IT

HALE BUTE ST PROJECT

GET IN TO CONSTRUCTION EVENT

What happened?

After working in Butetown for several months, it was clear that many local individuals were unaware of all of the opportunities in the field of construction.

Hale decided to link in with the IntoWork service to deliver a 'Get into Construction' event. This event was to showcase the breadth of opportunities in construction, and introduce people to construction partners who could help with just getting started, to getting paid employment.

Thanks to the Hyatt Trust, we were able to host this event at teh Butetown Community Centre, attracting over 50 individuals. A following 10 of these individuals were able to attend Hale's live construction site on a guest tour to explore the opportunities on site.



Results and Next Steps

From the sessions held, every individual was signed up with the IntoWork Service and encouraged to continue on to the complete their CSCS card.

Hale have since had individuals from this session complete on work experience placement on our Bute Street development.

We hope to see many more individuals from this session coming through the service and seeking opportunities to enter the world of construction.







STAKEHOLDER INVOLVEMENT

The success of this initiative was made possible by the collaboration between Hale, the IntoWork service, Cardiff and the Vale College and Sacyr. All came together to deliver presentations and were able to answer any follow up queries.

Without the support from these partners, we would not have been able to offer support, right from entry level training, to apprenticeships and live employment opportunities.

KIER - THE COURTS

Project Name: Ysgol Cynefin (The Court School) Fairwater & Llanrumney

Project Overview:

Kier construction are delighted to be building the new Ysgol Cynefin as part of Cardiff Council and Welsh Governments band B Sustainable Communities for learning. The new school will replace the current Court ALN school in Llanishen, thus helping to meet the city's demand for primary age specialist provision. Split between two sites, the two new builds for The Court School in Cardiff will accommodate additional capacity for pupils across the city, increasing the number of places from 42 to 72 places and providing enhanced facilities adjacent mainstream primary schools.

Spotlight on Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships: Building Skills and Futures

Apprenticeships have played a vital role across our projects, not only in supporting the development of future talent but also in contributing to the long-term sustainability of the industry. So far, we have proudly hosted 14 apprentices, contributing a combined total of 230 weeks of on-site experience at our Ysgol Cynefin sites. These apprentices have brought a diverse range of skills including Electrical, Engineering, Carpentry, Site Management, and Scaffolding.

By offering hands-on learning opportunities, we help apprentices gain real-world experience, build confidence, and develop the technical and professional skills needed to thrive in their careers. These placements also strengthen our commitment to social value, ensuring that our projects leave a lasting legacy in the communities we serve.

118 weeks of trainees on the project supporting their career journey

Local School Visits: 218 hours over 17 visits engaging with over 1933 pupils

The Ysgol Cynefin team have been busy supporting local projects such as St. Mellons Hub Youth project, hosting food and fun activities with local primary schools, creating a WW1 trench at Fitzalan high school to support learning, volunteering at Mossrose Cottage supporting adults with invisible barriers and lots more!





CENTREGREAT ENGINEERING

Inspiring the Next Generation: Centregreat's Involvement with Cardiff West Community High School Leads to New Apprenticeship Success

Back in 2023, Centregreat proudly took part in the Cardiff Commitment Industry Connect Scheme which was arranged and managed by Gareth McCarthy, an initiative that brings together local businesses and schools to help young people discover future career opportunities. The year-long project saw Cardiff West Community High School partner with organisations from across the construction and engineering sectors to give Year 10 students valuable insight into real-world projects and the variety of roles available.



Centregreat Engineering played a key part in the initiative, delivering an engaging classroom session led by Operations Director James Connolly and Engineering Director Dave Chapman. During the session, students learned about steel engineering, bridge design, and the processes behind delivering complex infrastructure projects.

Following the classroom session, Centregreat hosted three visits to its Cardiff engineering workshop, where around 30 students experienced first-hand how bridges and steel structures are designed and fabricated. These visits allowed students to see theory come to life and provided a glimpse into the dynamic world of engineering and construction.

One student in particular, Year 10 pupil Ashley Brockway, showed a keen interest in learning more about Centregreat's work - especially the electrical side of the business. Ashley returned for a second visit, eager to deepen his understanding. Over the next two years, he stayed in touch with Dave Chapman, demonstrating his enthusiasm and commitment to pursuing a career in the industry.

That dedication paid off. In 2024, Dave Chapman presented Ashley with an award at the Cardiff West Community High School Awards ceremony in recognition of his continued interest and engagement. In 2025, shortly after completing Year 12, Ashley was offered an apprenticeship with Centregreat, joining the company's Traffic Signals division, where he is now beginning his career in engineering.

This inspiring journey highlights the real impact of community partnerships like the Cardiff Commitment. They not only open doors for young people but also help businesses like Centregreat nurture local talent and invest in the next generation of skilled professionals.

"Seeing Ashley's enthusiasm develop over the past two years has been incredibly rewarding," said Dave Chapman, Engineering Director at Centregreat. "It's proof that initiatives like these make a genuine difference not just to the students, but to the future of our industry." Centregreat continues to champion opportunities that connect education with industry, ensuring that young people across South Wales can explore exciting and rewarding careers in construction, engineering, and infrastructure.


ONSITE CONSTRUCTION ACADEMY (OCA)
