# **HALE - BUTE STREET**

### **Project overview**



The scheme is set to deliver 45 flats for our clients at Cardiff Council.

Many of these residents will be relocated from Nelson House, which is close by on Loudon Square.

These homes are built with innovative technology, such as ground source heat pumps, which will keep down fuel costs and allow residents to have a modern and efficient home.

There is also a community space on ground level, which will be run by Cardiff Council. This space will allow for different community groups to rent the space and utilise the building.

We hope that the blend of homes and community space will allow for this to be incorporated into the community and a proud place for people to live in.

Brandon is working on the Vale of Glamorgan's Cadoxton Primary School Project for Kingfisher Developments.



The scheme will consist of 41 flats, community centre, MUGA, car parking and communal garden. All the properties will be built to Welsh Government DQR standards for use as Council rented accommodation, designed to EPC A standards.

The project is being constructed in partnership with Cardiff Council, Blake Morgan, Pentan Architects, Grays Consulting and Service Design Solutions.


# EAGLESWELL PROJECT IMPACT REPORT MAY 2023 - NOVEMBER 2024


# GASWORKS PROJECT IMPACT REPORT **JULY 2023 - OCTOBER 2024**

Cardiff Living, a partnership between Cardiff Council and Wates Residential, aims to deliver 1,700 homes across Cardiff. The former Gasworks site in Grangetown, Cardiff, has seen 155 new modular homes built to support homeless families in Cardiff.

# ASPEN GROVE & ADDISON HOUSE PROJECT IMPACT REPORT OCTOBER 2020 - JULY 2024

Cardiff Living, a partnership between Cardiff Council and Wates Residential, aims to deliver 1,700 homes across Cardiff. The former Eastern High site in Rumney, Cardiff, now known as Aspen Grove, has seen 170 new homes built. Additionally, a Community Living Block for over 55s, called Addison House, contains 44 new apartments.











# **LOVELL - ST MELLONS**

### ST MELLONS COMMUNITY LIVING PROJECT

**Project overview -** Situated on Crickhowell Road, on the site of the former Youth and Community Centre, the St Mellons Community Living project will provide a total of 60 one and two-bedroom, self-contained apartments for social rent.

The new apartments will be built to very high sustainability standards and be powered by solar panels to help ensure they are affordable to power and heat for tenants. A wide range of on-site communal facilities will also be delivered, including electric scooter charging points, bicycle storage, activity rooms, residents' lounges, a health suite and landscaped gardens, enabling the new building to provide a hub of services for older people from within the wider community.

**Dates -** Construction work started in January 2024 and is expected to be completed in summer 2025.

# **KIER - THE COURTS**

# YSGOL CYNEFIN (THE COURT SCHOOL) FAIRWATER & LLANRUMNEY

**Project overview -** Kier construction are delighted to be building the new Ysgol Cynefin as part of Cardiff Council and Welsh Governments band B Sustainable Communities for learning. The new school will replace the current Court ALN school in Llanishen, thus helping to meet the city's demand for primary age specialist provision. Split between two sites, the two new builds for The Court School in Cardiff will accommodate additional capacity for pupils across the city, increasing the number of places from 42 to 72 places and providing enhanced facilities adjacent mainstream primary schools.

The schemes are a part of Cardiff Council and Welsh Governments band B Sustainable Communities for learning. The project will be aspired to NZC and BREEAM Excellent whilst including, CLT Frames, photovoltaic, Airsource heat pumps and rainwater harvesting.

Project status: In progress, due for completion Feb 2026

Framework: SEWSCAP

# **KIER - THE COURTS**

### **Employment**

Thrilled to share partnership with Cardiff Onsite Construction academy, Elite supported employment and Cardiff into work services. The team have successfully employed 6 people through these services in roles ranging from labouring, to skilled plumber to administration support.

### **Education**

The team have successfully delivered over 200 education hours to Ysgol Pen Y Bryn, Greenhill PRU, Cantonian High School Cardiff West High School, Mary Immaculate High School, Eastern High School and the existing Court school covering topics such as Design, Ecology, Building Structures and Careers in Construction. The team have also given time supporting local students at Cardiff university through their Career Confident events and hosted over 10 weeks of work experience supporting school leavers, Cardiff and Vale College students as well as those starting their careers via Elite supported employment, supporting adults with additional learning needs.

### **Community**

The project has significantly uplifted the local area by donating over £21k to the community from charitable donations supporting homeless projects, play sand to local schools, mud kitchens for local nurseries, to full garden refurbishment at local day centres supporting adults with additional needs. The team are incredibly proud to support local causes leaving a positive legacy in the area Kier works.

The Kier team have regularly supported local Fairwater FareShare initiatives donating supplies for pancake day and Easter and continue to support them throughout the project. The Fairwater Team have also ran workshops at local youth hostel teaching young people some essential life skills such as basic home electrics, plumbing and painting.

# **WILLIS-MOUNTON HOUSE**

## MOUNTON HOUSE - CREATION OF NEW PRU UNIT

**Project Location:** Chepstow

**Project Overview:** The scheme involved the remodelling and refurbishment of the existing building, and works to outdoor spaces. The new facility provides places for pupils and a base for the wider Pupil Referral Service, which supports children unable to attend school for a variety of reasons.

Project Status: Completed

As part of the Mounton House PRU project, Willis undertook a wide range of social value initiatives, including construction workshops with PRU pupils, apprenticeship opportunities, charitable donations, and volunteering. Key examples include:

### **Mounton House Pupil Construction Skills**

Following an introductory session at their current facility - which included a careers talk and a guided site tour - Willis arranged a series of interactive site visits for PRU pupils.

- **Site Induction:** Pupils completed a site induction with the Site Manager, learning about site safety and PPE.
- Hands-on Carpentry: With permission, an unused garage space on the grounds was converted into a carpentry workshop. Pupils worked with Willis carpenters to build workbenches and outdoor planters for use at the completed school.
- **Teamwork and Skill Development:** After initial practice and planning sessions, pupils constructed their own workbenches and planters.
- Ongoing Support: Willis supported pupils in painting the planters and continues to offer engagement opportunities, including CSCS Card access, M&E sessions, and career signposting in the construction sector.

### **Chepstow Foodbank**

- Paul Cachia (Health, Safety & Training Manager) and Emma Lewis (Business Development Manager) volunteered at Chepstow Foodbank, assisting with food deliveries and learning about the organisation's challenges.
- When the team shared a maintenance issue on-site, Willis arranged for carpenters to assist with repair work, continuing their support for the Foodbank's vital community efforts

### **Dean Farm Trust**

- Willis donated £500 to help keep the animals warm over winter.
- Additionally, a team of carpenters volunteered at the farm, relocating a chicken house and building play structures for the goats as part of ongoing maintenance and support.

### **Community Donations**

- Palmer Centre: £500 donation to support their Dementia Café, a crucial local support network.
- Foster Wales: £500 donation to assist with events, along with a commitment to ongoing support via the Foster Wales Charter.









# **CMB - FAIRWATER COMMUNITY CAMPUS**

### FAIRWATER COMMUNITY CAMPUS

Project location: Fairwater

**Project Overview:** Fairwater Community Campus, £110 Million project which is 4 buildings, 3 schools. Wales' largest education facility. The new home for Cantonian High School, Riverbank Primary and Woodlands High School. Including a Health & Wellbeing block.

**Project Status:** Current **Framework:** SEWSCAP

Local people employed onto the contract =

Work experience opportunities for local people = 33 hours

**Apprenticeships =** 11 First Year, 12 2+ years - 21 weeks each (financial year)

**Local School visits =** 197 hours (financial year)

Others = Helped set up a PTA for Pen Y Pil, Helped set up a burger van enterprise at FCC. Supported 2 people to finish their NVQ, created 11 jobs for unemployed, a further 2 for long term unemployed, 1 for an ex-offender and then 4 roles across site.

Due diligence in supply chains refers to the process of assessing and managing risks associated with the sourcing, production, and distribution of goods and services. It involves a thorough investigation and ongoing monitoring to ensure that suppliers and business partners comply with legal, ethical, and environmental standards.

The Ardal collaboration is committed to this process and invites an appropriate person from our many suppliers to complete the attached survey (which should only take 30-45 minutes), which we are sure might also assist an organisation to identify potential gaps in their standards.

We have already had completed questionnaires from suppliers including Wenick Buildings Ltd, Willis Construction, R & M Williams, Encon Construction, Ian Williams, Willmott Dixon Construction, SWG Construction (Build & Renovate) Ltd, Tilbury Douglas & John Perkins Construction Ltd.

# ONSITE CONSTRUCTION ACADEMY (OCA)

### 2024-25 Highlights

### Case Study: Macauley - From Site Visit to Employment Success with Hale

Macauley had already obtained his CSCS card through the Get into Construction programme, delivered in partnership with Communities for Work+ (CFW+) and CELT+ in the Vale of Glamorgan. However, despite holding his card, Macauley lacked hands-on, on-site work experience—something he was eager to gain to kick-start a sustainable career in construction.

In March 2025, he attended a site visit at Hale in Penarth, an event organised collaboratively by the OCA, Hale, Acorn Recruitment, the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), and CFW+/CELT+. Macauley showed strong interest in the industry and was particularly enthusiastic about taking part in voluntary work experience (VWE) to build his practical skills and confidence on site.

At the time of the site visit, Macauley was preparing for the birth of his child and made the decision to delay his VWE placement until after his baby was born. Once ready, a one-week VWE placement was arranged for him in June 2025.

Macauley made an immediate and lasting impression during his placement. His strong work ethic, reliability, and eagerness to learn were quickly recognised by the team at Hale. As a result, Hale offered him a job at the end of his placement and have committed to supporting him further by helping him gain his crane licence—paving the way for even more opportunities within the construction industry

Macauley's journey highlights the power of collaborative working across local partnerships to remove barriers and support individuals into meaningful employment.




# ONSITE CONSTRUCTION ACADEMY (OCA)

The Onsite Construction Academy South East Wales (OCA) is a training, experience and employment programme for careers in the construction industry. Funded by CITB and delivered by the Into Work Advice Service, the OCA supports contractors and job seekers (new entrants, returners and career changers) of all ages across the Cardiff Capital Region, preparing job seekers for work in the sector through onsite experiences and funded training.

Our candidates represent some of the most disadvantaged and unrepresented demographics including the unemployed, economically inactive,

long term unemployed, young people not in education/employment/training, care experienced young people, over 50s, ex-offenders, BME ethnicities and females.

We are experienced in working with tier 1 companies, contractors, supply chains and recruitment agencies, supplying reliable and committed candidates to support the achievement of Community Wellbeing Benefits targets around employment and skills and we are always seeking work experience and employment opportunities for our candidates.

## **INTO WORK CARDIFF - TRAVIS PERKINS**

Over the past 18 months, the Into Work Employment Liaison Team and Travis Perkins Managed Services partnered on three employment projects to help unemployed residents of Cardiff. The program, which took place in February 2024, October 2024, and July 2025, provided participants with CV writing workshops, work shadowing opportunities, and one-on-one guidance. These efforts aimed to improve participants' employability, confidence, and job prospects.

### **Key Outcomes**

**Overall Engagement:** From a total of 51 referrals, 25 participants attended the workshops and 24 went on to work shadowing placements.

**Employment & Development**: Two participants were hired for paid jobs at Travis Perkins, and three are still in volunteer placements. All attendees left with updated CVs, interview experience, and increased confidence.

**Support Provided:** The Liaison Officer dedicated over 130 hours to screening, workshop delivery, and ongoing support for participants across all three projects.



### July 2025 Session Highlights

The most recent session saw 12 participants attend, making it one of the largest and best-prepared groups. The two-hour CV workshop focused on Travis Perkins' job requirements, with all attendees receiving tailored guidance. The participants were then all offered work shadowing placements, which were scheduled to continue into September 2025.

### **Success Factors**

The project's success was driven by:

Strong collaboration between the Into Work team and Travis Perkins.

Continual improvements to the program based on feedback from earlier sessions.

Increased engagement from external partners like the DWP and Careers Wales.

A shared commitment to social inclusion and creating genuine opportunities.

### Conclusion

This partnership has successfully provided direct job opportunities, valuable real-world experience, and personal growth for participants. This model serves as a strong example for future collaborations between local government and socially conscious businesses.
